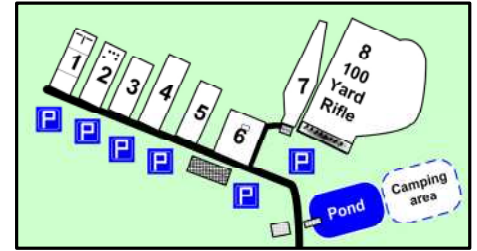
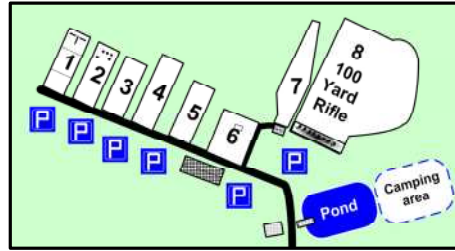
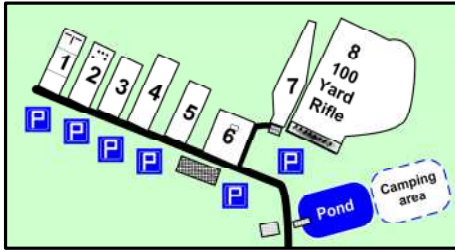

### Range #1: Falling Plates

**Size:** 100' deep x 40' wide  
(33 x 13 yards)

#### Range Specific Rules:

This range is for pistol shooting only. Exception: Rifles may be shot on this range with the following pistol calibers using lead bullets (no jacketed or gas checks or plated): 22 long rifle, 32 H&R, 32-20, 38 / .357, 38-40, 41, 44-40, 44, 45 Colt. This exception is for "Cowboy Action" matches and practice. The falling plate targets can not be used for rifle shooting.

### Range #3: Moving Targets

**Size:** 130' deep x 35' wide  
(43 x 12 yards)

#### Range Specific Rules:

This range is CLOSED for general use. It may be used for special events.

### Range # 5 – Qualification

**Size:** 131' deep x 65' wide  
(44 x 22 yards)

#### Range Specific Rules:

This range is open for use when not being used by law enforcement. Pistol, rifle, muzzleloader, and shotguns are permitted on this range. Target holders are to remain on this range, do not remove the wire hooks that hold the targets.

### Range #2 Steel Rngers

**Size:** 100' deep x 68' wide  
(33 x 23 yards)

#### Range Specific Rules:

This range is for pistol shooting only. **Exception:** Rifles may be shot on this range with the following pistol calibers using lead bullets (no jacketed or gas checks or plated): 22 long rifle, 32 H&R, 32-20, 38 / .357, 38-40, 41, 44-40, 44, 45 Colt. This exception is for "Cowboy Action" matches and practice. You may use the steel "ringers" that may be present. Wooden target stands by the shed may be used, and must be returned to the shed after use.

### Range #4: Pistol, Rifle, and Muzzleloader Range

**Size:** 156' deep x 35' wide  
(52 x 12 yards)

#### Range Specific Rules:

This range is for shooting at distances up to 50 yards. Pistol, rifle, muzzleloader, and shotguns are permitted on this range. Target stands from shed area may be used, and must be returned to the shed after use.

### Range # 6: Archery Range

**Size:** 115' deep x 81' wide  
(38 x 27 yards)

#### Range Specific Rules:

Archery only, NO firearms are permitted on this range.

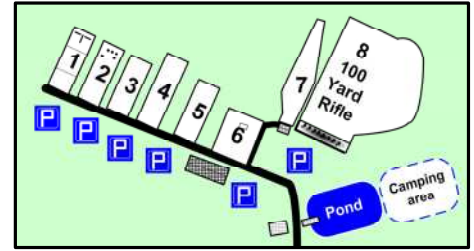
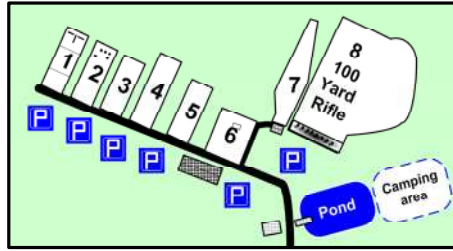
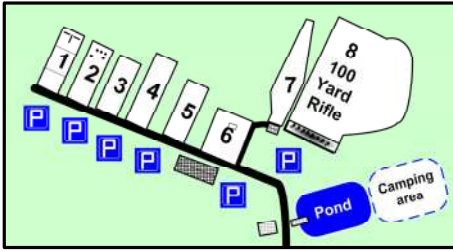

### Range # 7: Silhouette

**Size: 100 x 40 yards**

#### Range Specific Rules:

This is a known distance range of 25, 50, 75, and 100 yards. This range may be used for pistols, rifles, and shotguns. NO shooting at less than 25 yards. Shotgun patterning and clay target shooting should use this range. Do not bunker your targets against or shoot into the railroad ties. All shooting must be done from the firing line.

### Range # 8:

**William H. Clark, Jr. Range  
(100-Yard Rifle Range)**

**Size: 300' deep x 300' wide  
(100 x 100 yards)**

#### Range Specific Rules:

This is a known distance range of 25, 50, and 100 yards. This range may be used for pistols, rifles, and shotguns. Targets must be placed so that shots impact the backstop without a ricochet. Shooting must be done from the firing line. Target stands are on the range. Return target stands when finished.

### Rules that Apply to All Ranges:

- Always keep the muzzle pointed in a safe direction
- Treat every gun as if it is loaded
- Always be sure of your target and beyond
- Keep your finger off the trigger until you are ready to fire
- The range flag must be flown whenever there is shooting on ANY range
- Report any repair needs to an Event Chairman or a Director
- Pick up all brass and clean your shooting area when finished
- Use of armor piercing or similar type ammo is PROHIBITED

### Club Shooting Rules:

1. Range activity (shooting) hours are from 9:30 a.m. until **one-half hour before sundown** for non-scheduled events.
2. The range flag (on the rifle range) must be flown, whenever ANY range is in use. Please lower the flag when all shooting is finished on all ranges.
3. For safety and insurance reasons, no fully automatic firearms are permitted on Club grounds. No firearm shall be discharged in a manner to simulate fully automatic fire. NO "SPRAYING" ALLOWED.
5. ALL shots must impact the target or the backstop.
6. All firearms shall be unloaded when not in use. Open bolt indicators are suggested. During a cease-fire, firearms should be visibly unloaded (action open, magazine removed).
7. All firearms must be pointed in a safe direction (usually downrange).
8. All shooters MUST wear safety glasses and hearing protection. Also, people entering a live range MUST wear eye and ear protection, even if not shooting.
9. Only proper targets may be used on Club ranges — no bottles or cans. Bowling pins are permitted; however, Club Members must remove "used" pins from the property. The bowling pins do not burn and the club must pay to have them hauled away.
10. **NO ALCOHOLIC BEVERAGES OR ILLICIT CONTROLLED SUBSTANCES ARE PERMITTED ON CLUB GROUNDS.**
